By reporting the quantity of tyre disposals you manage on a monthly basis, you are supporting the tracking of used tyres to ensure they are responsibly managed by TSA accredited collectors and recyclers.

Once you have activated your TSA Data Reporting account, data reporting is a simple process as outlined below.

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Activate your account

TSA will send an activation email to the business email provided in your application. **Click on the link in the email** and follow the prompts to set up your username and password.

Some categories have expanded tyre types to accommodate the variety of tyre sizes available on the market today and varying weights at end-of-life. Default 'types' such as CAR and SUV can be used if you are unable to split tyre sizes. Refer to bullet instruction for guidance when using default codes.

Select your tyre categories, codes and defaults

- Click on the ALL tick button at the top of each category to deselect all tyre types (If all tyre types are relevant to your business then leave ALL selected)
- To individually select the tyre types applicable to your business, click on the tick button rext to the tyre code.
 Note: You can hover your cursor over code to reveal its full description.

• Use **Default** types where available if you're not sure.

Example of using a *Default code:

- If you are unable to split SUV tyres by below 18inch (SUV code) and greater than or equal to 18 inch (SUVL code) place all SUV, 4x4 and RV tyres into the SUV default category code.
- Do not use "SUV *Default" to capture other types of tyres (such as Car or Motorbike) in the Motorbike and Passenger Car tyre category.
- This logic will apply to all tyre types that contain a default under specific categories.
- Continue to select the tyres your store handles under each category.
 - You can remove a category if it is not relevant to your store by deselecting ALL.

- For accredited retailers the default preset is units.
- If your preference is to report in tonnes, you will need to select TONNES each time you login.

Select your waste tyre collector or recycler

To find and select your TSA accredited collector or reycler, start typing the name of your output service provider in the Source Business Name or Suburb/ABN or Generic text field.

- Names of accredited collectors and recyclers will appear as you type.
 Scroll to select or type name in full. Refer to this link for a current list of accredited collectors and recyclers: https://www.tyrestewardship.org.au/accreditation/find-accredited-recyclers-collectors
- To enter data relating to collectors or recyclers not accredited in the Scheme, use generic Non-listed tyre collector(s) or Non-listed tyre recycler(s) specific to your state.
- If you have more than one tyre output (e.g. you leave some tyres with customers or some customers take their used tyres away with them), you will need to add data for the first row before you can add another output. Refer to next step for data entry. The process described above can be used to find the output name (e.g. "Off-Site Tyre Fitment (Left with Customer)" or "On-Site Tyre Fitment (Returned to Customer)").

IMPORTANT:

TSA needs to know if your collection arrangements change. Make sure you reflect this change in your reporting.

Report and submit your tyre data

Enter the quantity of tyres disposed under the appropriate category and tyre type:

- If you report in tonnes use decimal to indicate tonnes (eg 1 tonne = 1.0)
- If you are using a small screen or laptop and you can't see all of the categories selected, click on the scroll icon (located the top right of the category menu) to move across the page.

Once data is entered click on **SUBMIT DATA** button located top right of the screen:

Edit feature and reporting period

You can update your current period data at any time between the 1st and 28th of the reporting month by clicking on EDIT DATA button.

From the 29th to the 1st day of the following month access to the period will cease.

Reporting Off-Site Tyre Fitment (tyres replaced by retailer and left at customer's site)

Data relating to tyre fitment done in a location that is different to your place of business is important data for TSA. Simply consolidate the monthly quantity of tyres (by tyre type) that are left with customers and report this data using the Generic - "Off-Site Tyre Fitment (Left with Customer)" specific to your state or the state your customer is located in, if different.

Reporting On-Site Tyre Fitment (Returned to Customer)

You can also report data when tyres are replaced at your business and the used tyres are given back to the customer. Use generic: **"On-Site Tyre Fitment (Returned to Customer)"** applicable to your state of operation.

Other possibilities for output could be silage on farms, council landfill or transfer station.

Reporting Zero Data

If you have no data to report, leave all data fields empty and click on SUBMIT DATA.

This important step confirms you have no data for this reporting period. This will prevent further reminder emails being sent to your account for this period.

Tyre categories, codes and defaults

When is it okay to use a *Default code?

If you are unable to split CAR tyres less than 18inch (code CAR) and greater than or equal to 18 inch (code CARL) place all passenger car tyres into the CAR *Default type code. Do not use "CAR *Default" to capture other types of tyres (such as SUV, 4X4, RV or Motorbike) within the Motorbike and Passenger Car tyre category. Apply this logic to any tyre type that contains a default under specific categories.

Industrial and Forklift tyres Forklifts, port equipment, platform lifts, ground support equipment

ISL	Industrial and solid large (32" to <38")
ISXL	Industrial and solid extra-large (\geq 38")

Agriculture and Forestry Tractor tyres

AGS	Tractor small (<20")
AGM	Tractor medium (20" to <32") *Default
AGL	Tractor large (32" to <38")
AGXL	Tractor extra-large (38" to \leq 48")
AGG	Tractor Giant (>48")

Earthmoving tyres Graders, dump trucks, above underground haulers and loaders, skid steers

EMS	Earthmover small (<20")	
EMM	Earthmover medium (20" to <24")	
EML	Earthmover large (24" to <36") *Default	
EMXL	Earthmover extra-large (36" to \leq 56")	
EMG	Earthmover giant (>56")	

Aviation Aircraft tyres

AVS	Aircraft small (≤8″)
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AVL Aircraft large (>8")

Conveyor belts and rubber tracks

CBSC	Conveyor belts with steel cords
CBMP	Conveyor belts with multi-ply
RTKA	Agricultural rubber tracks
RTKI	Industrial rubber tracks
